A little more about St. Oliver Plunkett

Last week we heard about the life of Archbishop Oliver Plunkett as he sought to re-build the Catholic faith in Ireland in the 1670's under the Protestant persecution at the time. It was alleged that he had conspired to bring 20 000 French soldiers into Ireland to force out the British and had levied a tax on his clergy to raise a force of 70 000 local men for a rebellion. At his first trial in Dundalk in Ireland, Plunkett faced an all-Protestant jury, however, the prosecution case collapsed, as the witnesses themselves were wanted men and afraid to turn up to court. The trial was then moved to England where he was denied the basic rights of all accused- he was not represented by counsel; given no opportunity to call witnesses for his defense, and he was deprived of the criminal histories of those who gave evidence against him. He was convicted in June 1681. In the sixteen days between his trial and execution, he was visited by a large number of Catholics and Protestants seeking his blessing. Within days of his death, those who had been involved in the fabrication of evidence were exposed, but it was too late for the Archbishop.

Interfaith Statement on Domestic Violence

A joint interfaith statement involving Buddhist, Baha'i, Hindu. Islamic, Jewish and Council of churches talks about the prevention of family violence and violence against women, as follows:

- The rate of women killed by an intimate partner in Australia increased by nearly 30% in 2022-23, compared to the previous year. In 2024, one woman is violently killed in Australia every four days.
- As faith community leaders we oppose family violence against women in all its forms, and call upon people of faith to play a role in its elimination.
- Violence is not just physical, it can be psychological, emotional, sexual, financial or spiritual. The roots are abuse of power and the control of one person over another.
- Across faith traditions we declare:
 - Sacred texts, scriptures and cultural traditions should not be used to justify or excuse violence against women
 - We undertake a journey together to raise awareness in our communities and to stop violence against women before it occurs.

PARISH FUNDRAISING: 3 NOVEMBER


Please join us on Sunday 3 November after the 8am and 10am Masses to
